

WELCOME

Welcome to US Army NATO (USANATO). A smooth transition to USANATO begins with good sponsorship. It is imperative that you initiate and maintain contact with your assigned sponsor immediately. Your sponsor is the one person who can help ensure that you and your family arrive in country and begin in processing smoothly. Be sure to address your concerns and questions before your arrival, so that your sponsor and gaining unit can assist you properly. Prior to your arrival, your sponsor should have made billeting reservations, airport transportation pick-up, and in-processing appointments for you as a minimum. Make sure to inform your sponsor of any last minute flight changes or reporting delays. Below is a highlight of what you can expect at your country of assignment. The information here is not all inclusive and may change over time. It is especially important to check and verify a country's requirement for passport and visa.

PORT CALL

All Soldiers and most families arriving to Ramstein Air Base, Germany on Permanent Change of Station (PCS) move will arrive at the Ramstein Gateway Reception Center via Air Mobility Command's military chartered airlift, The Patriot Express. Flights depart from BWI Airport, AMC Terminal and arrive at Ramstein Air Base, Germany. USAREUR Command Policy requires that all personnel and accompanying family members process through the Soldier and Family Reception Center. Personnel will be available in the baggage claims to expedite this process. Your sponsor and/or unit representatives will be present to pick you up upon arrival. If not, you will be transported by the "S Bus" to the Garrison Personnel Office, where you will be met by Garrison staff. If you are flying commercial from Frankfurt Airport, ensure your sponsor is tracking as soon as possible for coordination of transportation.

SHIPPING HOUSEHOLD GOODS: You will arrange your household good shipment through your nearest transportation office. Attend the local briefing, and schedule your pick-up. If "non-temporary storage" is checked on your PCS order, you can store your household goods instead of shipping it, or opt for partial storage. SHIPPING YOUR VEHICLE: You will schedule your move through the US Transportation Command. You should contact your nearest transportation office, and locate the nearest Vehicle Processing Center. Keep receipts for any/all expenses incurred while dropping-off your vehicle. Pay attention to the tracking number you were given. The status will update when the vehicle arrives at the Bremerhaven port, when it's being shipped to Graf, and when it's arrived. When it says it arrived, go ahead and call the Vehicle Processing Center office to confirm it's arrived and you can pick it up. There are several documents you need to bring to pick up your vehicle. For more information visit: <https://pcsmypov.com/PickUp>. Pick up POV at Kapaun, Bldg. 2806 You will have to take your car through the inspection (free) and registration process. It requires many documents.

Ensure no tint on front windows and suggest emergency kit prior to picking up your vehicle. You will also need to get a Rations Card for fuel. You can do this at the Shopettes or PXs. As U.S. military, we are eligible to pay U.S. prices for fuel instead of expensive German prices, but you have to have a Rations Card (also called Esso Card). Each vehicle is allotted a certain amount of fuel per month at this price, but if you go over, you can always fill up off post. You have to load money on your Esso card before the German Esso station will accept it. You do not have to do this if you are buying fuel on post. Esso Cards are only accepted at German Esso stations, not at other countries.

ARRANGING YOUR FLIGHTS: SATO/CTO handles the booking of flights. You may be on a commercial airline, which lands at Frankfurt International Airport, or you be fly on the Patriot Express through Ramstein Passenger Terminal. Be sure to send your itinerary to your sponsor to make transportation arrangements. If you notice that you forgot something when you get here, there is large American PX mini-mall on nearby Ramstein Airbase. For contact information visit: <https://www.cwtsatotravel.com/home.aspx>

LUGGAGE: You are normally allowed 2 check bags per person up to 70lbs each, unless you check-in with partner airline Lufthansa. Lufthansa's policy is 3 bags at 23kg each, so pack an extra collapsible bag. You may have to tell the ticket clerk that you are on PCS orders. If you are charged, you can annotate this on your travel claim. If you are flying the Patriot Express, please reference the flyer attached for luggage/pet restrictions.

PETS: Most airlines have a limited number of slots for pets, but you have to book early. There are other options such as PetAir, but be cautious of summer blackouts, when it gets too hot for pets. Germany also has some specific laws regarding microchipping, vaccinations, dangerous breeds, and quarantine. For more information visit: <https://www.petrelocation.com/country/germany>

PASSPORTS: You will use your PCS orders and PASSPORT(s) to enter Germany. If you do not already have a CAC, then you will also need a passport and second identification. You can visit your nearest military passport office to apply for no-fee government passports. For relocations from CONUS you are authorized an official (red) passport. You will need the forms from the Command, so please call or email Mrs. Anita R. Haynes at DSN 314-549-5478 or anita.r.haynes.civ@mail.mil. You are required to have and travel with a tourist Passport if traveling outside of Germany. You are also advised to travel with the passport that contains your SOFA stamp (official or "no fee" passport) when traveling in Germany. Simply put, your tourist passport lets you out of Germany while your official passport with SOFA stamp (often called your "no fee" passport) lets you back into Germany. SCHOOLS: There are eleven schools located in the USAG Kaiserslautern across the various Kasernes and Air Bases. Please click the link to find to more information <https://www.dodea.edu/Europe/east/schools-by-district.cfm>. Please contact us for information on schools, child-care, EFMP, and family-friendly activities in the area. Things to keep in mind: wait lists for on-post childcare are typically 6 months, and require an enrollment packet. You can lessen this time by starting the process ahead of time. Your temporary lodging

location will determine which DoDEA school your child(ren) will attend. To avoid issues with school zones between temporary lodging and permanent housing, be cautious of where you chose to stay. CYSS programs require an annual physical, which can be accomplished prior to your departure from the United States. It is suggested that you complete them early, as it takes time to adjust your healthcare enrollments OCONUS, and find a new physician. NEAREST TREATMENT FACILITY/HOSPITAL: Landstuhl Regional Medical Center (LRMC) is the largest Healthcare center outside of the U.S. It provides primary care, tertiary care, hospitalization and treatment. Patient Liaison Officers are available to assist people who may need special services available only at local German facilities. Dental facilities in the USAG provide general dentistry and specialty treatment to authorized individuals. TRICARE Prime through International SOS provides assistance with local dental doctors through MetLife Insurance for Family Members. <http://www.dhc-europe.amedd.army.mil/activities/RheinlandPfalz/kleber.html>.

Keep Your DEERS Information Up To Date Eligibility for TRICARE is determined by the services and reflected in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS). It is important to keep DEERS records up to date. Due to coverage requirements under the Affordable Care Act, TRICARE must be able to verify your coverage status based on what is listed in DEERS. Your Social Security number (SSN) and the SSN of each of your covered family members must be included in DEERS for your TRICARE coverage to be reflected accurately. For more information, visit www.tricare.mil/deers. As the TRICARE Overseas Program (TOP) contractor, Intl. SOS has developed a provider network in your enrolled remote location. This network includes hospitals, emergency, primary care, and specialty care providers. There are no enrollment fees for TOP Prime Remote beneficiaries and medical care is available on a cashless, claimless basis. In order to receive cashless, claimless medical care, TOP Prime Remote beneficiaries must follow the

procedures outlined below. It is also important to understand the Point of Service (POS) benefit and how Other Health Insurance (OHI) is used when receiving care in TOP Prime Remote locations. International SOS is available to assist you 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and you may call collect, if available. For toll-free contact information, visit www.tricare-overseas.com/contactus. Point of Service Option: The TRICARE Prime Point-of-Service (POS) option allows TOP Prime and TOP Prime Remote Active Duty Family Members (ADFM) to pay additional out-of-pocket fees to receive non-emergency health care services from any host nation provider without referrals. Note: Prior authorization requirements for certain services may still apply when using the POS option. Visit www.tricare.mil/FindDoctor/Appointments/Authorization.aspx for more information. If you still have questions or need assistance when using the POS option, contact your TOP Regional Call Center.

TEMPORARY LODGING: There are numerous places available for lodging both on and off post. Your sponsor will help you determine the best facility and location to meet your needs. Your sponsor should assist you with reservations and with transportation arrangements. Some of your options are Ramstein and Vogelweh lodging (<http://af.dodlodging.net/property/Ramstein-Inns-Ramstein>); TLA (<http://ramstein.bookoo.com/s/ta>); Hotel Barbarossahof (<http://www.barbarossahof.com/index.php?lang=en>); Hotel Christine (<http://www.hotel-christine.com/>); Hotel Burgschaenke (<http://www.burgschaenke-kl.de/index.php/en/home>). All of these options have family style quarters, you just have to ask. If you choose a TLA, be sure that you get a nightly rate upfront. All Housing needs will be handled by the local USAG Kaiserslautern Housing Office. Located on Vogelweh post, Building 1001. The guesthouses at Ramstein, Kaiserslautern, and Landstuhl offer affordable and comfortable alternatives to local hotels and pensions. You are authorized TLA to partially cover the additional expenses incurred while you occupy temporary lodging, as well as the expense of meals and incidentals (this covers laundry, transportation and dry cleaning) outside the continental United States. For more information, visit here. The guesthouses at Ramstein, Kaiserslautern, and Landstuhl offer affordable and comfortable alternatives to local hotels and pensions. You are authorized TLA to partially cover the additional expenses incurred while you occupy temporary lodging, as well as the expense of meals and incidentals (this covers laundry, transportation and dry cleaning) outside the continental United States. For more information, visit here. Payments are made in 10-day increments. You are required to visit the Kleber Kaserne Finance Office for TLA information briefed by the housing office. The number of days of Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA) varies for each individual based on the availability of housing at the time of arrival. <http://www.housing.af.mil/Units/Ramstein/>

HOUSING OFF-POST: When you are searching for a home, there are a few things to keep in mind. First, German homes are typically much smaller than American homes, with multi-family apartment buildings being popular. Top floors apartments offer great views of the city, but often do not have elevators, keep that in mind when searching. Availability of parking near your home, should also be a consideration. The military housing office is available for your use, and has a list of approved apartments that you may search. It is not required that the housing office approves your contract, however you should use their form. The form is in German and English, and breaks down separate costs, which will assist you in understanding exactly what your monthly costs will be. It also offers some protection to you, in the event that you must break a lease, which typical German contracts do not provide. Please begin your search prior to your departure from CONUS, there are several websites available. The official military referral list is www.homes.mil. Unofficial/commercial websites are www.aHRN.com, www.ramstein.bookoo.com, www.immobilienscout24.de, http://www.housingoffice.com/en/index_01_sp1_1.html. What you see on

these websites go quickly, especially during PCS season (summer), so once you have seen the property, you will need to make your decision quickly. You may set up appointments prior to your arrival.

UTILITIES/ EXTRA COSTS: If you are authorized off post housing be mindful that utilities and maintenance fees can add up quickly and fluctuate with the euro exchange rate. Make sure you see the entire contract cost, before you agree to sign. Even a verbal agreement, constitutes a contract under German law. Ask how the home is heated, whether gas, electric or oil. It is best to avoid oil heating, as you will need to re-fill the tank annually. The cost of oil can be unexpectedly expensive, and you will need to pay upfront.

VAT/UTAP: If you are authorized off post housing you may participate in tax free benefits overseas. German taxes are 19% for utilities and sales off-post. You can enroll in the Utilities Tax Avoidance Program (UTAP) which is a \$99 fee up front, but saves you the tax on utilities. You will see the return on your investment in about 4 months. Additionally, the UTAP office can negotiate with utility companies, if issues arise. *Be sure that you get your meter readings before you move into a home, or you will have trouble enrolling.* The Value added Tax (VAT) program, is used for large purchases on the economy. The VAT form itself is \$4, and you can get a total of 10 at one time. This is great for purchases that you will make for your new home (furniture, television, 220V appliances). **What is a VAT form?** The Value Added Tax (VAT) for purchases in Germany is between 8-19% and is automatically included in the price of products and some services (i.e. auto care). From the Tax Relief Office, off Gettysburg, you can purchase VAT forms to use at the time of purchase to save the tax. Not all stores accept them; ask prior to making your purchase. As a newcomer, you can purchase a set of 10 forms for \$40. Thereafter, VAT forms cost \$5. The whole process for using the forms will be explained when you purchase upon in processing.

ELECTRICITY: The electricity in Europe is 220V, which means that many of your appliances should not be used, including lamps and hair dryers. If you are eligible for LQA, you can opt to use government washers, dryers and refrigerators through FMO. To use your American electronics, you can buy voltage converters on post. You should be cautious though, as using voltage converters will cost you more in utilities. The good news is that many of the newer electronics that you buy in the States are dual voltage, especially computers, televisions, and cell phone chargers. To determine dual voltage, look on the power source; for these you only need an adaptor. Don't confuse an adaptor for a converter. Adaptors are small, white or black, they allow you to use the outlets but do not convert the voltage. You will burn out your appliance if it is not compatible.

DRIVING: You cannot drive more than 30 days in Germany, without a USAREUR driver's license. Don't throw out your American license though, you must have a valid stateside license to receive a USAREUR license. You will have to take the USAREUR driver's test. Study! It's not an easy test. www.usareurpracticetest.com. If you already have a CAC card, you now can take the test through JKO at <http://jko.jten.mil>. Under Course Catalog ensure the "courses" tab is selected and select "USA" from the drop down. Enter 007 in the course number field and click search. Enroll and take USA-007 "U.S. Forces Driver's Training Program for Europe (2 hrs)". When you are ready, enroll and take the exam USA-007-B "U.S. Forces Driver's Training Program for Europe – Final Course Exam (2 hrs)." Once you have passed the exam simply print out your certificate and bring it with you to Germany. Present it to the drivers office when you in-process to receive your USAREUR license. Different countries within Europe also have different laws, so study those specific to where you are going. Additionally, if you plan on being able to drive outside of your country of duty, then you will also need an international license. You can obtain these either through AAA in the United States, or from the USAREUR driver's office.

VEHICLE INSURANCE: You may want to consider switching to a local insurance. Your American vehicle insurance may cost you an unnecessary amount of money outside the United States. Most military-friendly businesses like USAA and Navy Federal Credit Union offer insurance overseas. Some people choose to have a German insurance company. ADAC (equivalent to AAA in the U.S.) offers insurance packages to add onto your regular car insurance.

BANK ACCOUNTS: You will need a local bank account for your German bills. Service Credit Union, and Community Bank, offered on the military installations are international, and have the routing numbers (IBANs) you will need. You can also open a local German account with proof of residence, and they offer better exchange rates and fewer fees.

MAIL: The Army Post Offices (APOs) at Kapaun, Sembach and Daenner are full-service facilities, providing parcel service and transport of all classes of mail from priority to express. They also transport mail for free from APO to APO and or APO to FPO when "MPS" is written in the upper right corner of envelopes and packages. Mail from the United States will require a CMR box, similar to a Post Office box. With orders, your sponsor can help you contact the local mailroom to set it up before you get here. Ramstein Mail Room Hours: Pick Up Mon – Tues: 1000 – 1700, Wed: 1200-1700, Thu-Fri: 1000-1700, Sat: 1100-1300. PHONE AND INTERNET: You have many options to choose from, depending on the services you desire: T-Mobile, TKS, O2, Vodaphon, Deutschland Kabel. Most of these companies have offices located on the military installations. If a cellular phone is something you desire, be sure to also look at prepaid plans, which can often meet your needs for cheaper. Be careful with contracts, especially when considering TDYs, deployments or terminating services. You are not protected in Germany like you are in the United States, against cancellation fees, even with companies that sell you contracts on post. TKS and Telekom (T-Mobile) are the most commonly used providers. Mobile phone "pay as you go" and contract options are available through both providers as well as internet and home phone options. You can use the same phone as the one you had in the U.S., but you have to contact your service provider (Sprint, Verizon, etc.) and have them unlock the phone. Then you can use your new SIM card from your German provider.

TKS is in the Ramstein PX. TKS offers cable and movie service. Once you are assigned a house and have an address (even if you have not moved in yet) go ahead and set up internet service as it can take several weeks to get service established. **How can I keep up with my family stateside?**

Some providers offer free calling to the U.S. from a landline house number. Ask before you purchase a

phone/internet plan. There are also several apps to use including WhatsApp, Skype, MagicJack or Facetime if you have an iPhone. **What are some good phone apps to use?** There are too many to list, but some popular ones include: Bahn, GoogleTranslate, ooVoo, WhatsApp, Skype, MagicJack, ViaMichelin, TripAdvisor, Mango (language tutor, get your free subscription with your post library card).

Pro Tip: How to dial a phone number

The country code for Germany is +49. If you are dialing to a German phone number from the US (or any other country), it's +49 123-45678901.

If you are dialing a German phone number from another German phone number, you drop the +49 and replace it with a zero. So, 0123-45678901.

Also, in Germany, phone numbers can be of different lengths, not the standard 10 numbers like in the US. So don't get confused if you see a phone number that's only 6 digits long!

To dial to the US from a German phone number (or any other country), it's +01 (area code) - seven-digit-number. So, +01 123-456-7890.

IN-PROCESSING: Headquarters and Headquarters Company (HHC) will issue you an in and out-processing checklist upon arrival and departure. You will need to coordinate with your sponsor or HHC to ensure all requirements are met for these actions. Please follow each of the steps in the checklist and work closely with your sponsor and HHC in submitting your required documents to start/stop your overseas entitlements, and establish your network access (in the USRAEUR domain).

MANDATORY ONLINE TRAINING: Here are the required trainings needing completion upon 30 day of arrival.

WHO: AFNORTH SMs, Civilians, On Site Contractors, & Local National Employees

WHAT: Complete 4 online training classes (OPSEC Awareness, Unauthorized disclosure of classified information, Insider Threat Awareness, Introduction to INFOSEC)

Introduction to information security (CDSE) OR Information Security Program Training NOTE: If you have completed any of these above training after the 20 Jul 20, no need to retake the training, just resubmit all certificates together. IT SUPPORT: HQ, G6 will supply all of your IT needs. Upon arrival you will complete a System Authorization Access Request SAAR Form to NIPR account requests and issue NIPR computers and hotspot devices. VPN access can also be requested from the C Co HQ if needed. Most of your emails will be on NATO Secret servers; the VPN can be used to access your .mil emails.



Electrical Appliances in Germany (TRANSFORMERS)



1. PURPOSE: To provide current information on the use of electrical appliances in Germany for soldiers being assigned to the Army in Europe, and their family members.

2. ISSUE:

- a. The electric current in Europe is 220 volts, 50 cycles compared to 110 volts, 60 cycles in the United States. You must use a transformer when using 110 volts, 60 cycle's appliances here in Germany.
- b. Some appliances will not operate on European current. For example clocks operate the 5/6th the normal speed. This means they lose ten minutes every hour.
- c. Other motor-driven appliances operate satisfactory, although not at their best at 5/6th the normal speed. These appliances include vacuum cleaners, electric razors, egg beaters and blenders.
- d. Most appliances with heating elements (toasters and irons) operate satisfactory with a transformer. However, the transformers are inconvenient, particularly in larger sizes. They are heavy, consume a lot of electricity, and may trip circuit breakers. Therefore, you may find it easier not to use appliances, such as coffee-maker, toasters, hair dryers, or irons which usually require a large transformer. However, these appliances can be purchased in Europe at the military exchanges, thrift shops, German retailers and yard sales.
- e. A very important rule of thumb is to ensure the polarity is correct before connecting your appliance to a transformer. A polarity tester can be purchased at your local AAFES for under \$10.
- f. A few general guidelines for lamps small appliances are listed below.
 1. Lamps: Floor, desk and table lamps that use incandescent bulbs can be used by changing the 110 volt to 220 volt bulb and adding an inexpensive adapter plug to match the German outlet (220 volt bulbs and adapters are available at military exchanges).
 2. Televisions: American model TV's (NTSC) can only pick up Armed Forces Network (AFN) television broadcasts and cannot receive European (PAL) stations. Most government housing areas receive AFN broadcasts. You should ask your sponsor or housing office representative about AFN reception. Dual voltage, multi-systems television sets can receive broadcasts from both German and American stations. These can be purchased at military exchanges.
 3. Video Recorders: Videos can record AFN broadcasts, but the clock timer does not operate properly. American movies can be rented through AAFES stores. Only special designed videos recorders (multi-system) are equipped to receive German TV signals. Multi-system videos recorders can be purchased at AAFES stores.
 4. Home Computers: These operate properly with a transformer. Ensure the polarity is correct or you will burn up your computer. Best advice is to consult your AAFES computer representative for specifics prior to setting up your computer.
 5. Radios, Stereos, Turntables, and Tape Decks: Radios and stereo equipment work satisfactorily with transformers and receive both AFN broadcasts and European stations. Turntables and tape decks can also be modified to run at proper speed.
 6. Microwave Ovens: As a general rule, microwave ovens for use with 60 cycle power cannot be used at 50 cycles and will not operate properly with a transformer. 60 cycle microwave ovens (110 volt 50/60 cycle) may be damaged by operation on 50 cycle power. Special microwave ovens which can be used in Europe and converted for use in the US are available at military exchange.

- g. The size transformer you need: Before plugging an appliance into a transformer, make sure you know its power rating. The power rating of electrical appliances is indicated in "watts" or in the case of large power-consuming units, "kilowatt". (1 kilowatt equal 1000 watts). On some appliances "amperes" are used instead of watts. To determine the power rating in "watts", multiply the number of amperes by the voltage of the appliance. For example, if you have an appliance marked 3 amperes, 110 volts; it has a power rating of 330 watts ($3 \times 110 = 330$).
- h. Each type of transformer is designed to carry a specific "load" or number of watts. Its "load" or wattage rating must never be exceeded.
 1. Don't ever attach an appliance which requires more wattage than the rating of your transformers. When attaching a combination of appliances, the total wattage rating must not exceed the rating of the transformer. For example, a toaster drawing 1100 watts should not be used at the same time as a waffle iron drawing 1100 watts. The total of such a combination would exceed the rating of the 1600 watt transformer by 600 watts. Your transformer would burn out.
 2. Don't purchase a transformer with exposed winding or wiring. Transformers are available at AAFES and the thrift shop.
 3. Don't use a transformer in a damp or wet place. Transformer should always be kept dry and well ventilated.
 4. Don't handle or move a transformer when it is plugged into a socket. Be sure you first disconnect the transformer. A 1600 watt transformer should never be used in an ungrounded socket or with an ungrounded plug. The 1600 watt transformers in military exchanges are equipped with grounded plugs (called SCHUCCO® plug).
 5. Transformers should never be handled when your hands or feet are wet.
 6. Transformers will generate a certain amount of heat when in use. This is not detrimental unless the transformer feels hot to the touch.
 7. Overheating may be caused by a defective electrical appliance which can burn out a transformer completely. Inspection will reveal whether the fault lies in the appliance or the transformer. Both should be inspected by a competent electrician.
 8. Most military exchanges stock transformers with the following rating:
 - a. 75 watts – For use with small radios, phonographs, tape recorder, heating pads, sewing machines.
 - b. 300 watts – For use with large radios, phonographs, tape recorder, heating pads, sewing machines, projectors, electric blankets, small and medium fans, warming plates, and television sets.
 - c. 500 watts – For use with floor polishers, small refrigerators, hair dryers, and blenders.
 - d. 750 watts – For use with large projectors, small irons, percolators, coffee makers, and vacuum cleaners.
 - e. 1000 watts – For use with small heaters, large percolators, coffee makers.
 - f. 1600 & 2000 watts – For use with toasters, roasters, broilers, cookers, fryers, frying pans, grills hot plates, medium heaters, irons, and motor-driven appliances.

FAQs ON PHONE CONTRACTS

Recently an increasing number of my clients have sought legal advice on issues surrounding their cell phone contracts, because their expectations were not in line with the terms and conditions applicable to the cell phone contracts they had signed. To enable you to make a better-informed decision before entering into a cell phone contract, let's look at five of the most common areas of misunderstanding:

(1) How long does a 24-month contract run?

If you think it lasts two years, just covering your tour in Germany, you might have made an expensive mistake. The 24-month period does not refer to the length of the contract but to the period during which the contract cannot be terminated. The contract itself runs for an indefinite period of time, for all cell phone contracts contain an automatic renewal clause, extending the contract for one year and thereafter for another year and so on, once the first 24 months have passed.

(2) What do I need to do to stop an automatic renewal of the contract?

If your guess is that you just need to tell them so, you are gambling. Your desire to prevent an automatic renewal needs to be expressed in writing to the cell carrier no later than three months **BEFORE** the contract is up for renewal. You could ask for the automatic renewal to be blocked right after you signed the contract. If you wait until the day on which the contract is up for renewal, you are too late and on the hook for another 12-month period.

(3) What happens if I lose or break my phone?

The cruel truth: too bad for you, as you have a 24-month contract (with an automatic renewal clause). The company will issue a replacement SIM card for a fee. However, the SIM card and the phone are two separate items. The latter is often merely subsidized, depending on the contract, but losing or breaking the phone does not entitle you to a new one and provides no ground for an early termination or discontinuance of your 24-month contract (with automatic renewal clause).

(4) Is an online bill a good idea?

The answer depends on your personal situation. How good is your German? Chances are that the carrier's website is all in German. Set-up, registration, and/or modifications via the website will be impossible unless you have a basic idea of what you need to do. Often the companies charge an additional fee for mailing a hard copy of the bill to you. If you wish to receive a bill in the regular mail, make sure your mailing address is correctly displayed on the contract; a letter addressed to SPC John Doe, Kleber Kaserne, Kaiserslautern, will not find its way to you.

(5) Do I have a right to terminate the contract with "military orders"?

The Servicemembers Civil Relief Act (SCRA) is a US law that does not apply to German contracts. Absent such a statutory right to terminate cell phone contracts upon a PCS move, the issue is left to the individual phone service carriers and the contracts concluded with them. The shop representatives never put their eloquent verbal sales statements into writing, making it next to impossible to prove them. They often simply claim to have used a lot of vague language like "may," "might," and "could," because, contrary to any allegations, the general terms and conditions of the cell phone contract do **NOT** provide for an extraordinary termination right in case of presentation of military orders. Consequently, cell phone companies generally offer to dissolve the contract in consideration for a lump sum payment, based on the remaining monthly basic fees still owed under the contract up to the next ordinary termination period.

German Kindergarten Information

German Kindergartens serve children ages 2-6 and are varied in their policies. Priority for spaces are for citizens of the EU in many of the kindergartens. Some programs having waiting lists, so please take that into consideration when looking for care. If spaces are available, they will probably accept your child right away. Some do not allow foreigners in their programs.

There is no single listing of kindergartens as almost every village has one. Some are run by the church and others through the local city government. As you decide on potential locations to live, you can begin to inquire about the local kindergartens. Please check directly with your Rathaus or Verbandsgemeindeverwaltung ("City Hall") for your village to check if there are any spots available at your local German Kindergarten.

There are Waldkindergartens, "Forest Kindergartens" in some villages. Children are primarily outdoors.

Once you know where you will live, it will be much easier to define what your choices are especially with regard to German Kindergartens.

GERMAN SCHOOL INFORMATION

In general, to enroll, for Elementary School (Grundschule grades 1-4), you will need to visit the school which serves the area you live. Administrators can request a basic knowledge of the German language, however it is not mandatory. Admission will have to be discussed with the administration of the school, who usually requests approval from the German Authorities.

Just like in the US, your residence determines where your child will go to school. Before starting school, the children will need to be screened by a German doctor at the Health Department correlating to the school they are zoned for.

Elementary Schools in Germany service grades 1-4. After 4th grade, the German school system splits, based on your child's academic abilities. For more information, please talk to your village's elementary school or Rathaus (City Hall).

German schools often start around 0800, but let out earlier in the afternoon. Elementary schools usually end between 1215 and 1315. Students are required to bring a snack/bag lunch to eat during recess around 1000. In general, there is no option to purchase food or drinks at the schools and there are no water foundations.

Keep in mind, the German School System may follow different recess schedules. They will have to attend school on several US Holidays (Veterans Day, Thanksgiving, etc), but will be out on Germany Holidays.

The German Public school system is free of charge, with the exception of required books and materials, which need to be purchased by the parents. Some schools may offer for students to rent books for a reasonable fee.

Students stay in a "Klassenverband" all through Elementary School, meaning they remain with the same classmates for the entire four years of Elementary School. They often keep the same homeroom teacher throughout the entire time as well, but will still be taught by other teachers in classes like PE or Music, for example.

Homeschooling in Germany

"In 2008, the Ministeriums für Bildung, Wissenschaft, Weiterbildung und Kultur advised that it was the position of the State of Rheinland-Pfalz that the mandatory schooling provisions in German Law (that essentially prohibits home schooling) does not apply to US personnel stationed in Germany who are covered by the NATO Status of Forces Agreement. In 2014, we re-confirmed with the Ministeriums für Bildung, Wissenschaft, Weiterbildung und Kultur that this was their official position. However, the 86 Airlift Wing takes no position on the application of the mandatory German schooling law to US personnel and recommends that anyone wishing to home school their child(ren) consider discussing the matter with a private German attorney."

The Department of Defense has established 11 schools within the Kaiserslautern Military Community to meet the educational needs of children from Kindergarten through 12th Grade.

The school your child attends is determined using the same method as in the United States; by physical home address, not the parent's workplace address.

Parents may request an exception to the feeder zone policy. This request can be made at the school that they are zoned for. Requests require signatures from both the losing and gaining school principals. The final decision is made by the Community Superintendent.

It is important for parents to understand if an exception to feeder zone policy is approved, school bus transportation will not be provided outside of designated school feeder zones.






